
What is an Herbicide?

Herbicides are commonly known as weedkillers. These are substances that are used to control unwanted plant material. Some include chemicals that are toxic to plants and can eliminate them. Others are used to prevent plant material from germinating such as Pre-Emergent. Pre-Emergent is a chemical used to prevent plants from growing before they start. How does Pre-Emergent work?

Pre-Emergent creates a chemical barrier that prevents weeds from germinating.



Facts about Pre-Emergent

- It does not affect existing weeds or plant material.
- Effects last 6-8 months.
- Chemical is safe after application.
- Works best after it's been watered into the soil.
